

Ineligible Cal Grant Schools for 2024-25

(8 Total Ineligible Schools)

Cal Grant participating colleges, universities, and career technical schools must meet various eligibility requirements in law to be able to receive Cal Grants. The two required thresholds* for the 2024-25 academic year are:

- 1. Schools must keep their federal student loan Cohort Default Rate (CDR) below 15.5 percent.**
- 2. Schools must keep their graduation rate above 30 percent.**

Schools on this Ineligible Cal Grant Schools list did not meet one or both of the required thresholds for the 2024-25 academic year. This list does not include ineligible institutions that are ineligible this year and have been ineligible for the prior two years or longer.
