



- ✓ User ID
- Password
- Security Questions





# 2024-25 CADAA Enhancements

## Recommendations

- Consistency of CSAC branding, CADAA login page
- Add CADAA training video to login/registration page
- Add notification of skip logic as FYI to students
- Update AB 540 criteria, requirements to qualify
- Re-word grade level question
- Make Help & Hints button more visible or display automatically
- Consistency with use of capitalization and pronouns throughout the form
- Embed AB 540 affidavit within online CADAA (AB 1540)
- Supplemental Help & Hints on all tax return questions with visual aids
- Build parental signature into original submission, eliminate separate PIN creation process
- Create a CADAA Demo/Simulator
- Improve account registration process



## 2024-25 CADAA Enhancements

## Removal of CADAA Questions?

- Dislocated worker
- ITIN or SSN (perhaps just SSID)
- Driver License Number and DL State

## Addition of CADAA Questions?

- Depending on AB 1540, collection of answers to AB 540 determination questions
- Race/Ethnicity
- Expansion of college selection, 10 to 20 schools
- Interested in DSIG?





# AB 540 Requirements



Time and Coursework

## Option A:

3 years high school credits and 3 years total attendance at any of these schools in California:

- Elementary School
- Middle School
- High School

## Option B (SB 68/SB 1141):

3 years attendance (or equivalent) at any of these schools in California:

- High School
- Adult School
- Community College\*

\*SB 114 amended SB 68 and allows more than two years of full time attendance at a CCC to be counted.





# AB 540 Requirements

## 2. Degree or Transfer Eligibility

- Graduation from a California High School (or the equivalent, GED, HiSET, TASC, CHSPE) or
- Earned an associate's degree from a California Community College or
- Met the minimum requirements to transfer to a CSU or UC

## 3. Non -resident Tuition Exemption

Student files waiver (AB 540 affidavit) with the college or university






# AB 540 Affidavit




Undocumented students who are eligible for a non-resident tuition exception must complete and submit the AB 540 Affidavit to the admissions office at their college of attendance.







# **Best Practices**




Customizing your roster is one way to find your CADAA applicants.


- Ensure collection and distribution of non-resident tuition exemption form between Financial Aid Office and Admissions & Records, <u>prior</u> to disbursement.
- Train all staff on AB 540 eligibility, including proper state residency determination.
- Confirm your Financial Aid Management System (FAMS) codes AB 540 students appropriately.
- Update AB 540 verification policies & procedures as needed when state and federal regulations change.
- Remember that most CADAA filers do not realize they are required to have an AB 540 Affidavit on file (or even know what it is).






# California Dream Act ISIRs

# Non-Immigrant Visas and TPS



Only Temporary Protected Status (TPS) holders or U Visa holders are eligible for AB 540:

- ✓ TPS or U Visa holders should file CADAA
- ✓ T Visa holders should file FAFSA
- ✓ Countries with TPS status can change

# California Dream Act Service Incentive Grant



Started in **2021–2022** 

- Cal Grant B recipients who completed the California Dream Act Application or Cal Grant A recipients that met Cal Grant B eligibility
- 1,667 Cal Grant B Service Incentive Grants of up to \$4,500 per year
- Must complete 300 community or volunteer service hours during the academic year (7/1-6/30).
- Attend a California public or independent institution
- Removed the "proration" of awards, and now provides stipend awards without regards to a student's part-time or full-time status.





# Qualifying Organizations

### What is a qualifying community or volunteer service organization?

- Any business on the List of Service Organizations
- Any school on the Cal Grant Eligible Schools List
- Nonprofit as defined in Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code
- Any federal, state, or local government entity
- Organization shall have been established for a minimum of 2 years before student begins volunteering
- Work performed is not advocacy of a political, social, or religious nature
- Volunteer service is related to the participating student's field of study or is in furtherance of community service or a community need

How do businesses register as a Qualifying Service Organization?

Organizations submit the Service Organization Registration form. CSAC will verify that the organization meets the criteria above.





# Approved Service Organizations

#### California Dream Act Service Incentive Grant Program

#### List of Service Organizations

Nonprofits & Federal, State, or Local Government Entities

Students can volunteer with any of the organization(s) on the List of Service Organizations or any organization not on the list if it meets the criteria for a qualifying community or volunteer organization. Organizations not on the List of Service Organizations, can complete and submit the Service Organization Registration form found in DSIG Forms.

#### What is a qualifying community or volunteer service organization?

- A nonprofit as defined in Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.
- Any federal, state, or local government entity.
- Any school on the Cal Grant Eligible Schools list on the <u>CSAC website</u>.
- Organization shall have been established for a minimum of two years before the first date on which a participating student begins performing service hours to qualify for this program.
- Community or volunteer service performed by the participating student is not advocacy of a political, social, or religious nature.
- Community or volunteer service is related to the participating student's field of study or is in furtherance of community service or a community need.

# California DREAM Loan Program for Graduate Degree Programs

# Eligibility Requirements



- Must be AB 540 Eligible
- Must attend a CSU or a UC
- Complete a DREAM Act Application
- Determined to have financial need
- Academic Program must qualify as an eligible program under Cal Grant guidelines
- Must be enrolled in programs leading to a professional or graduate degree

## DREAM Loan Terms



- Annual loan maximum \$4,000 (even if enrollment at multiple institutions)
- Aggregate maximum \$20,000 at any one institution
- Annual promissory note
- Interest rate matches Subsidized Direct Loan rate for that same year

G-55 Form

Application corrections are necessary when students:

- Complete the FAFSA instead of the CADAA
- Complete the CADAA instead of the FAFSA
- Complete an application for the wrong year
- Submit duplicate applications
- Gain permanent residency or citizenship

Student must first complete and successfully submit the correct financial aid application.

School then submits the Application Conversion Form G-55 with the corresponding documentation.




## Selective Service

Selective Service registration verification is no longer required for males between the age of 18 and 25



SB 169 removed the requirement for colleges to verify Selective Service registration



# **CADAA** Verification

~20% of CADAA applicants are randomly chosen for verification.

- Federal V1- Standard Verification Group
- ❖ AB 540 eligibility
- Students/parents residing in the United States file US tax returns, if they meet earning threshold

Complete verification <u>prior</u> to disbursing funds.

Update: Dept of Education waiver was not extended into the 23/24 AY and because of this, CSAC will not apply any V1 waiver for CADAA applicants in 23/24.
